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About Midlands Family Medicine

Midlands Family Medicine was founded in 1995 by doctors Gary L. Conell and Jeffrey C. Brittan. Physician Assistant Dave Arthur came to the practice with Dr. Conell. Mary Dailey, a nurse practitioner, started providing patient care at Midlands Family Medicine in 1997. Dr. Jason M. Citta joined the practice in 2002 following his residency training in rural Family Medicine. Dr. Shawn P. Murdock joined the practice in 2009 following his residency training in rural Family Medicine. The addition of Dr. Mark Nielsen in 2012 has expanded the services of Midlands Family Medicine as he is Board certified in Internal Medicine allowing expansion of the clinic to better serve the needs of our growing population. Cora Fisher, APRN joined Dr. Nielsen in his Internal Medicine practice in October of 2012. Shortly after, in November 2012, Kristina Downing, APRN joined Dr. Citta seeing patients. In late 2013, Dr. Kumar joined our practice after having worked as an inpatient hospitalist.

Dr. Conell has been the Rural Residency site director since the program's inception in North Platte and has successfully educated many residents who have since gone on to be successful physicians, some in the areas surrounding the community. Currently Midlands is set up to educate four residents in Family Medicine (two 2nd year and two 3rd year residents). However, given the transition of site coordinators, we will likely for the next few years Match to only one resident each year.

Midlands Family Medicine is a privately owned clinic with its providers having local hospital staffing privileges. Midlands can provide you not only with the medical education that you seek, but also business education and money management necessary for success.

Clinic Volume

Midlands is a fairly high volume clinic with our daily patient volume averaging about 200-225 patients per day. You will have your own continuity clinic that we hope with time will begin to fill up with patients that opt to follow you. However, you will also see patients from our physicians' schedules in order to get the experiences needed for your education.

Procedure Volume

The physicians of Midlands do a large number of procedures. Those procedures done in the hospital or surgery center will be available for you provided your rotation schedule allows it.

Upper/Lower Endoscopies – average 10-15/week

Cardiac Stress Testing – average 5-10/week

Vaginal Deliveries – average 10-15/month for Midlands providers, this does not include deliveries with OB C-Sections – we will no longer have a Family Medicine provider doing these however, you will be able to work with our local OB/GYN physicians as availability permits

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Residency Program Requirements

Required Rotations/Patient Types

All Rural Track residents will spend their first year in Omaha, Nebraska at the University of Nebraska Medical center where you will complete 12 months of rotations.

Upon completion of your first year, years two and three will be spent in North Platte to complete your rotation schedule (elective rotations can take place anywhere you choose).

Family Medicine Residency required rotations are noted below and are generally scheduled as noted below, however sometimes alterations must be made:

Behavioral Medicine (1 month) – done 1st year at UNMC

Cardiology (2 months)

CORE (1 month)

Dermatology (1 month)

Electives (6 months)

Emergency Medicine (1 month)

ENT clinic (2 weeks)

General Surgery (2 months)

Geriatrics (1 month) – done 1st year

GYN (1 month)

In-patient (3 months) – done 1st year at UNMC with Family Medicine Service

In-patient RTT (1 month) – done at rural site

Internal Medicine Elective (1 month)

Intro to Family Medicine/Community Medicine (1 month) – done 1st year at UNMC

Neurology (1 month)

Obstetrics (1 month) – done 1st year at UNMC

Obstetrics (2 months) - done at rural site

Ophthalmology (2 weeks)

Orthopedics (1 month)

Pediatric In-Patient (1 month) – done 1st year at Children's Hospital

Pediatric Out-Patient (1 month)

Pediatric Elective (2 months)

Practice Management (1 month) – done 3rd year

Pulmonary/ICU (1 month)

Radiology (2 weeks)

Sports Medicine (1 month)

Urology (2 weeks)



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As part of the residency program, national requirements include documentation of the following:

- 15 ICU/Critical Care patients
- 40 newborn visits got residents beginning in 2014
- 40 vaginal deliveries (10 continuities) for residents beginning before 2014

Continuity Clinic

Residents are required to participate in their continuity clinic for a minimum of 40 weeks/yr. with no more than an 8 week interruption for electives/leave of absence/etc.

Residents will be required to complete 1650 clinic visits of which:

10% of visits with children less than age 10 10% of visits with elderly over age 60

Call Duty

Your call responsibilities will be primarily based out of Midlands Family Medicine. You will be 1st call with a Midlands provider as your backup call. Your duties on call will be covering inpatient, outpatient, nursing home and Emergency Room calls which will include admission of patients for the call group. Our current call rotation is 1 night in 7 and 1 weekend every 7. You will as well be responsible for rotation specific call duty in addition to your primary call responsibilities.

You will be responsible for admitting/daily rounding/discharging the patients of Midlands providers that you admitted from your call duties in addition to any continuity patients that you may admitted to the hospital for an inpatient stay.

Resident Teaching Days/Didactic Teaching

Resident teaching days are currently scheduled for the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month. The teaching day is telecast to the physician lounge at Great Plains Regional Medical Center. Grand Rounds will also take place weekly on Wednesdays at noon and will be telecast as well. Your attendance at these teaching days is mandatory.

Additional didactic teaching will take place throughout the month independent of that done through UNMC and may include case reviews, journal reviews, presentations (both faculty and resident), and disease specific education.

We will try at various times to have scheduled formal rounds.

Procedure/Patient Documentation

Resident will be required to document various things regarding procedures done and special patient types seen during training. This required documentation is not only part of the Residency training, but is also essential to being able to provide hospitals with proof that you have been trained on, and have completed such things as procedures in order to credential you upon completion of the residency program. You will be required to keep this procedure log and patient list up-to-date.



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You will have access to a program through UNMC known as "New Innovations" through which you can keep record of your progress.

Your "New Innovations" account will be reviewed with you at each evaluation.

Scholarly Activities

Residents will be required to participate in scholarly activities throughout the program including development and presentation of a "Senior Project". Some of these scholarly activities will include practice improvement projects such as the METRIC program offered though the AAFP.

Resident Evaluations

Residents will be evaluated on each rotation by a direct supervising physician from that rotation. Residents will also have face-to-face evaluations every 6 months with the site director and any other appropriate supervising physicians.

Hours Restrictions

Residents are required to have 1 day in every 7 free of all duties. Typically speaking this will either be a Saturday or a Sunday unless other vacation days have been used during the week.

Residents are limited to a 80 hour work week averaged out over 4 weeks.

"Moonlighting" is permissible however these hours are included in your 80 hour work week and at no point will take priority over your rotation duties. Moonlighting must be approved prior to each scheduled session.
